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

SBAWP Participants Give Back



On September 4, 2014, 3 staff and 4 residents of the Fithian House volunteered at the Jubilee Soup Kitchen, in the Hill District. The Jubilee Soup Kitchen started as a place where persons in need could receive a hot meal every day between 8 am and 2 pm. The services currently available on-site include a soup kitchen, a medical clinic, John Heinz Child Development Center, Job Corner/Employment Center, clothing, and referral services.

The Fithian House residents and SBAWP staff helped to prepare the lunch meal to be served. The residents cut fresh fruit and vegetables that had been generously donated to make a tossed salad and a fruit salad to be served at 11 am for lunch. After they had finished preparing the

lunch, the residents had the opportunity to join the homeless in reading a verse from the bible and join in prayer for the meal that was prepared and about to be received.

In addition to preparing the meal, the residents passed out silverware and a snack, and assisted in serving the meal. The residents then had time to socialize with the luncheon attendees. Theresa Chutz, Fithian House resident, had the opportunity to socialize with several attendees who did not have a place to go after the meal was over. Upon returning to the Fithian House, Theresa said, "It was a new and eye-opening experience, an opportunity to give back to the less fortunate and be grateful for the things I have." The residents and staff plan to participate in a volunteer experience each month in order to continue to give back to the community they live in.

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New Picnic Tables for Fithian House Residents, Friends and Families



In November 2013, Isaac Harvey, a Sewickley resident and a student at North Allegheny High School, contacted SBAWP about wanting to do an Eagle Scout Project for the benefit of SBAWP. Isaac is a Boy Scout from troop 344 in Wexford Pennsylvania. He has been in the cub scouts and boy scouts for nine years. He was currently working on his Eagle Scout Service Project.

An Eagle Scout Service Project is the opportunity for a Boy Scout, Varsity Scout or qualified Venturer in the Boy Scouts of America to demonstrate leadership of others while performing a project for the benefit of his community. This is the culmination of the Eagle Scout candidate's leadership training, and it requires a significant effort on his part. Achieving the rank

of Eagle has to be done no later than three months after the occasion of an Eagle Scout's eighteenth birthday.

Isaac toured the Fithian House, a facility that houses 14 individuals who have spina bifida and live independently in Wexford. The residents' ages range from 26 to 41. Isaac shared his interests, skill set and asked about the SBAWP needs at the Fithian. Several potential

projects were discussed, but the one that resonated with Isaac was the need for wheelchair accessible picnic tables so that the residents could enjoy their cookouts on the patio off the lower level of the building. The residents did not have outdoor furniture that was practical for use with motorized or manual wheelchairs.

The project took about five months to plan. Isaac made several visits to the Fithian House to verify the required height and design of the tables to make them truly wheelchair accessible. Isaac made drawings and submitted the details of the project to his Scout Leader, troop committee and the council prior to starting the project. Isaac's goals in making the wheelchair accessible picnic tables were: (1) to be able to accommodate each individual's need for space, (2) create more space for more wheelchairs and (3) give residents a greater opportunity to have picnics, spend time with friends and family and hold community events outdoors.

Additionally, Isaac was successful in seeking financial support and material donations to construct the tables. On July 12th, Isaac, along with 12 other people (family and friends) arrived at the Fithian House with power tools and lots of lumber. They worked all day, and to our





surprise and pleasure, the finished product was not just one wheelchair accessible picnic table, but rather four high quality wheelchair accessible picnic tables. What a blessing for SBAWP and the Fithian House residents!

What Scouting Means to Isaac:

"Scouting has played a huge role in how I go about everyday life. I believe the biggest part of scouting were the leadership roles. In scouting as I have got older I believe being the leader has been the best way to go about, and it's not because I would have more power or seniority over someone, but because it puts me in a position where I have a great opportunity to help others and hopefully impact them in a positive way. It puts a whole different perspective on things. To me, being a leader is about who has more class and will be responsible and do the right thing in any situation, and even when the situation may get tough. A leader isn't the person who gets the most laughs for a



joke they told or the person who has the most friends. A leader to me is an individual who puts others before themselves. and looks for resolutions to problems that may have occur. They are charismatic, patient, attentive, respectful, committed, honest, and creative in the way they go about tasks. I believe they are not afraid to accept their mistakes, but will learn from their mistakes, and work to improve and become a better person overall, thereby motivating others to do the same."

What the Project Meant to Isaac

Personally: "This past summer I was given a great opportunity to give back to others. With the support from family, fellow scouts, and Adele Duffy, Executive Director, and her team from the Spina Bifida Association, it would not have been possible to complete this project. During the project, there was a sense of accomplishment and satisfaction seeing the project that took months to prepare for, come to life. On September 9, 2014, the Fithian House hosted a picnic, which was held outside at the new wheelchair accessible tables. It meant a lot to me seeing the residents and their families all being able to spend time with each other at tables where everyone fit. At the picnic especially, I enjoyed being able to talk to the residents and learn about their unique needs and abilities. At the end of the day it's great to know that my project made a difference and hopefully improved people's lives."

What the Project Meant to SBAWP and the Fithian House Residents:

"SBAWP benefitted greatly from Isaac's leadership ability, skill set, knowledge and willingness to give back to the community. The SBAWP staff, program participants and Fithian House residents enjoyed working and meeting with him during the course of the project and at the picnic celebration on September 9th. The wheelchair accessible picnic tables will be enjoyed for years to come, and we will always remember our new friend, Isaac Harvey and his gift to SBAWP. ■


